

# End of Course Assessment

1. Read this scenario. Then identify at least three safety risks: Josie's own children have a field trip and need to be dropped off at their school early instead of getting picked up by the bus at the usual time. After the hectic but excited drop off, Josie arrives back at her home just moments before a family arrives at her program. As she welcomes Gabrielle and his dad to her home, Josie sets her coffee cup on the counter and her purse on the ground. After she helps Gabrielle separate from his dad, she turns away to mark Gabrielle present on the attendance list. Gabrielle walks over to the play area, which is in an area of Josie's home her own family spends time in. Josie notices a board game with small pieces is still set up from family game night the evening before. She also notices a shelf is pulled away from the wall and an electrical outlet cover is missing from the socket.
