Feel free to ask any Lodging team member if you need any of these items replenished. If you forgot to pack any other toiletry item, please come see us at the front desk. GUEST RESPONSIBILITIES

1. **Check in time is 14:00 & Checkout time is 1100.** A late checkout fee equivalent to one night's stay will be assessed for unapproved check outs after 1100. Guest arriving after 1800 hrs must hold their reservations with a credit card.
2. For long term guests your bill is due every 15 days. Your credit card on file will be charged automatically so please ensure funds are available at that time, if not please coordinate with Lodging Management staff to work out a solution.
3. Before leaving your room, ensure all personal articles/items, to include clothing, are stored in the closet or dresser drawers. Housekeepers are not authorized to handle personal items; therefore, if items are left on the bed, the housekeeper will be unable to provide bed making service.
4. Ensuring rooms are kept neat and orderly at all times. If rooms are found in an unorderly mess a cleaning fee may be assessed.
5. Secure valuables and cash in your room safe. We are not responsible for lost or stolen items. Guest who report loss of property may/must file a claim against the government through the Grand Forks AFB Base Legal Office by filing out an SF Form 95.
6. Please be gentle with the furniture and leave furnishings where they are currently located. Guests will be responsible for any damages caused by movement or misuse.
7. Please do not use linens to clean your shoes, or for any other purpose other than its intended use. Place a newspaper or substitute under your shoes while cleaning to prevent damage to the carpet.
8. Report any maintenance or appliance failure to the front desk or housekeeping. Dial "0" for the front desk, or housekeeping at 99612-713-1944 from 0730-1530.
9. Tobacco Free Living Policy. In accordance with **AFMAN 34-135, 3.5.1**, Air Force Lodging Program: "All Air Force lodging common areas and guest rooms, are non-smoking areas." Guests who smoke in the rooms will be assessed a **\$150.00** cleaning (fumigation) and/or damage charge for property, carpet, upholstery, and drapery. Smoking is permitted in Designated Tobacco Areas (DTAs) only.
10. Pets are not authorized in your room. A fee of \$150.00 will be assessed if caught with a pet in the room.
11. Motorcycles, bicycles, and auto parts, are not allowed in the rooms or hallways.

Any damages to the room, furniture, or linen will be charged to the credit card we have on file. If you discover damages to your room upon check-in, please let the front desk know immediately.

Housekeeping Service

Housekeeping service is provided seven days a week. If a Do Not Disturb sign is displayed on your door at noon, service will be provided the following day. Please see the list of services provided in the following section of this directory.

Guaranteed Reservations

A guaranteed reservation is secured with a credit card. All other reservations will be cancelled at 1800 on the day of arrival. For guaranteed reservations arriving after hours, electronic key boxes are provided in the back of the lobby area with easy to follow instructions.

Late Checkout

Check out time is by 1100. After that time, a late fee equivalent to one night's stay will be applied. If you need additional time, please contact the front desk to request an authorized late check out.

Laundry Facilities

Registered guests are provided free use of washers and dryers. Machines are located on every floor except 2nd floor lobby area. The North Country Lodge is not responsible for articles left unattended.

Lending Books/DVD's

A variety of books and DVD's are available for guests to borrow while staying with us. Ask the front desk about our Book Exchange Program and DVD's available.

Lost and Found

Personal items left in a room will be turned in to Lost and Found. All items are disposed of after 30 days.

Luggage Room

A secure luggage room is available for registered guests during normal business hours. Please see the front desk for assistance. Please do not just leave your bag(s) outside the door, the staff is not responsible if anything happens to it.

Maintenance of Facilities

Please report any maintenance discrepancies to the front desk immediately or complete the maintenance request form located in your room.



GUEST SERVICES AND INFORMATION

Parking Areas

Authorized guest parking areas are available on the North, South, and West sides of the building. Only registered guests are authorized to utilize these parking areas. Parking spots marked with numbered signs are ONLY to be used by guests registered to those Suites.

Pets

Pets are not authorized in the North Country Lodge at any time. If pets are in government quarters, the occupant/owner will be charged a fee up to \$150 and the pet must be removed immediately. Reoccurring offenders will be asked to vacate the premises.

Smoking Policies

All guest rooms and common areas are non-smoking. Designated smoking areas are available. Those who violate the smoking policy will be subject to a fee of up to \$150.

Sundries and Souvenirs

A variety of sundry and souvenir items are available for purchase at the front desk during normal business hours.

Space Available Reservations

Space available reservations are granted based upon projected occupancy. All DOD ID card holders are authorized to utilize lodging on a space available basis and may sponsor guests.

Telephones and Voicemail

For your convenience, telephones are located in every guest room. Long distance fees do apply. For instructions on how to use your telephone, please see the information located in "Telephone Info" tab located in this directory.

Vending Areas

Soda, and snack vending machines are available on the first floor near the lobby. If you lose money in a vending machine, fill out a refund envelope and give it to the front desk. Your reimbursement will be processed by the vendor and returned to you. Please make sure to have you first and last name along with a good phone number, and how much you lost.

Wake Up Service

Rooms are equipped with an alarm clock radio. For automatic wake-up service through your telephone, please select the voicemail option on your phone then follow the wake-up call prompts.



HOUSEKEEPING SERVICES

Our housekeeping staff provides the following guest services to make your stay at NORTH Country Lodge as comfortable as possible. Please assist us by keeping your personal possessions off the floor and beds. The staff cannot vacuum the floor or make the bed if there are personal possessions left in these areas.

1. The housekeeping staff will provide the following services for **stayovers** (general):
 - Wastebaskets will be cleaned and emptied daily
 - Amenities will be restocked (hygiene products and coffee/tea)
 - Floors and carpets will be cleaned as necessary
 - Bed will be made
 - When towels are placed on the floor, they are removed and replaced
 - Toilets will be cleaned
 - If sundries are stored in the room, they will be restocked daily
2. In addition to the above items, the housekeeping staff will provide the following services on a weekly basis for **extended stay over's** (stays of 7 days or longer):
 - Sheets will be changed
 - Lights will be dusted and furniture polished
 - Vacuuming and mopping will be completed
 - Toilet and bathtub will be cleaned
 - Vanities, sinks, and mirrors will be cleaned
 - Shower curtain/door will be cleaned
 - Towels will be changed (if they haven't been already)
3. The housekeeping staff will thoroughly clean guests' rooms upon checkout, to include changing bedspreads, blankets, and linen; as well as all items listed above.
4. If a guest's door has a "**Do Not Disturb**" sign for more than 2 days in a row, the housekeeping staff is required to enter the room on the 3rd day and perform normal housekeeping cleaning duties. Allowing housekeepers access to your rooms. Per regulations and for the safety of our guests, housekeeping is required to enter all quarters every third day, regardless of a "Do Not Disturb" sign

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

SAFETY

1. No Pets are authorized in rooms. A kennel listing is provided above.
2. Smoking is not permitted in any of our facilities per AFMAN 34-135. Please go to a designated smoking area.
3. Applicable fees will apply for violating pet and smoking policies and procedures. For a list of these fees and others, refer to **Room Rates** located in this tab.
4. UL-approved coffee pots are provided for your use. Hot appliances such as irons, coffeepots, hotplates, etc. are prohibited and should not be stored.
5. Report low-pressure fire extinguishers to the front desk by dialing "0"
6. Familiarize yourself with all fire exits.

ENERGY CONSERVATION

Before leaving your room, please check to make sure that televisions, radios, and lights are turned off.

Please note, lodging rooms are equipped with energy efficient light bulbs. When turned on, the light bulbs will appear dull until they have warmed up. Please allow a few minutes for this process.



POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

BOMB THREAT

1. If you receive a bomb threat, ask the individual where the bomb is located and the time it will go off.
2. **DO NOT HANG UP THE PHONE**, the phone company will trace the call.
3. Use another phone to call the Law Enforcement Desk (**dial 911**) and notify them of the threat (**time and target**). Be sure to give them your **name, location (bldg. 707), and telephone number**.
4. Notify all occupants of the targeted building to evacuate immediately.
5. Evacuate a minimum of 300 feet from the building.

FORCE PROTECTION CONDITIONS

Force Protection Condition Alpha – Declared as a general warning of possible terrorist activity, and when circumstances do not justify full implementation of a higher force protection condition. This may be declared when incidents occur which could lead to possible terrorist incidents worldwide.

Force Protection Condition Bravo – Declared when there is an increased and more predictable threat of terrorist activity, even though no particular target has been identified. This will be declared if information exists that terrorist elements are actively preparing for operations or when Self-Regulatory Organization-1 (SRO), Increased Vigilance Posture, is implemented.

Force Protection Condition Charlie – Declared when an INCIDENT occurs or when intelligence is received that some form of terrorist action is imminent and DoD or US targeting is present. This will be implemented when SRO-2, Advanced Readiness Posture, is implemented.

Force Protection Condition Delta – Declared when a condition exists in the immediate area where a terrorist attack HAS OCCURRED or when intelligence is received that terrorist action is likely.

AREA ATTRACTIONS

Como Park and Zoo; 1225 Estabrook Dr, Saint Paul; 651-487-8200

Enjoy Como Lake with walking trails and fishing; an amusement park; lake side pavilion; conservatory; beautiful gardens, including the Japanese gardens, Water Lily Garden, Enchanted Garden, Palm Dome, Sunken Garden, Fern Room, Orchid House, and Bonsai Gallery; an 18-hole golf course; and free zoo. Conservation is an important part of the mission at the zoo and conservatory where they take an active role in helping to conserve our planet's resources- plants, animals and whole ecosystems.

Historic Fort Snelling; 200 Tower Ave, St Paul, 612-726-1171

This living history museum commemorates the establishment of a fort here in the wilderness in 1819 by Col Josiah Snelling and his troops, who opened the area for homesteaders. Costumed guides are the focus of a living history reenactment during the summer months, re-creating the activities of every army life during the 1820's. Allow one to two hours for your visit. Memorial Day- Labor Day Tues.-Sat. 10am-5pm, Sun. 12pm-5pm.

Landmark Center; 75 5th St W, St Paul, 651-292-3225

Landmark Center was built in 1902 and originally served as the Federal Court House and Post Office for the Upper Midwest. In the 1970's, a group of determined citizens saved the building from the wrecking ball and restored it to its previous grandeur. 




History

The 934th is known as the “Global Vikings” and also known as the “Flying Vikings”. They are the only Air force reserve unit in the state of Minnesota. The 934th air base also hosts the Army, Navy, Marines and Air National Guard. The 934th is made up of 14 units. The base as a whole occupies approximately 265 acres of land near the Minneapolis-St. Paul airport. The 934th uses 85 of those acres.

The mission for the 934th is to fly C-130H3 cargo aircrafts. They do both airdropping and air landing, cargo, and people. Aeromedical evacuation of patients within the theater of operation. The 934th also provides airlift both in the United States and around the world. Upon mobilization orders, they would deploy and become part of the active duty Air Force Air Mobility Command.

The land that the base and the airport are on used to be a dirt speedway in 1915. Then in 1920 the Minneapolis Aero Club leased the land for a new airport that was named Speedway field. In 1923, Speedway Field was renamed Wold-Chamberlain Field. It was named that in honor of the two Minneapolis pilots who lost their lives in World War 1. Wold-Chamberlain Field continued to be used by both the Minnesota ANG and Station Twin Cities as a training facility. George W. Bush, Sr. was its most famous student. In 1948, the name changed once more, this time it was named Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport.

In 1949, the first Air Force Reserve unit was assigned to the area.

In 1970, the Navy closed NAS Twin Cities and the AFR moved into the vacated space.
