Good day,

Thank you for your interest in obtaining FAA pilot/student pilot/air traffic controller medical certificate through Flight Medicine clinic at the 9th Medical Group, Beale AFB CA. The physical exam offered in this facility is FREE for military members and their dependents. **Due to FAA restrictions on AMEs working in federal medical facilities, only FAA Class 2 and 3 physical exams are offered at this time.**

Here are the steps for you as an applicant.

1. Go to FAA website and set up your MedXpress count. This account is permanent for you as an FAA airman. You will be using the same account for your medical certificate renewal in the future. Below is the screenshot of the web page.

2. Log in using your MedXpress account, fill out your on-line application form as pilot/student pilot/air traffic controller. When you are done, you will be given CONFIRMATION NUMBER.
3. Contact the FAA-designated AME at Beale at ki.lee.4@us.af.mil or call the flight medicine clinic at 4-4730 and place a telephone consult for the AME and provide your CONFIRMATION number. This gives the AME your authorization to access your on-line application for a review.
4. The AME will contact you to set up an appointment. Prior to the appointment date, please go to the clinic lab to submit urine sample. (The urine test is for disease screening and is NOT for drug screen).
5. On the day of physical exam, please check in at flight medicine clinic about 30 minutes before the appointment time. This is to allow enough time for several screenings such as height, weight, blood pressure, pulse rate, vision check, color vision test etc . We are located inside the Flight Medicine clinic at the 9th Medical Group.
6. Once exam is done, the AME will make every effort to give you the medical certificate on the same day. If not, you may pick up the certificate at a later time. If you have any questions for the AME about the physical exam such as FAA "waiver" process, you are encouraged to contact the AME prior to the physical exam by e-mail or by phone. Please remember, HIPAA privacy law applies for any personal health information you provide, and the answers will be mostly generic explanation of the FAA policy on certain diseases.
