What is the Private Pilot Course?

Aviation Administration (FAA) licensed private

pilot requires a minimum of 35 hours of flight training: 20 with an instructor pilot, and 15 hours of solo flight. This does not include the required



ground school to pass the FAA knowledge test, which takes an additional 35 hours of individual or classroom study. It is important to remember these are minimum times. The national average is 70 flying hours to earn the Private Pilot certificate. However, our students usually get it done in 50 to 55 flight hours.

How Long Does it Take?

This is the one aspect of the training that depends on your schedule and commitment. Our FAA-approved curriculum is designed to allow you to get your FAA license in minimum time, while ensuring you get all the training you need to safely operate an airplane in today's complex traffic environment. If you can manage time for three flights a week, it will take about three months to finish the flight training.
