Welcome to Dover Air Force Base Programs and Services

The Dover AFB Military & Family Readiness Center is the service organization for Air Force families and is a one-stop location where individuals can obtain reliable information and assistance on a wide range of important topics.

The Military & Family Readiness Center (M&FRC) provides the following services:

Information and referral, counseling and follow-up. Coordination and consultation with base and civilian agencies to strengthen policies and programs, all in an effort to benefit military families. Provide assistance for base leadership in their efforts to meet family needs.

Air Force Aid Society (AFAS)

Refers to AFAS for emergency financial assistance to eligible military members for basic needs such as: basic living expenses, emergency leave, or unexpected vehicle repairs. Community Enhancement programs sponsored by the agency include the following:

• Bundles for Babies Program

Education and information for expectant parents.

Child Care for PCS Program

Within 60 days of arrival to or departure from Dover AFB, members can receive 20 hours of FREE childcare per child. Childcare provided by licensed on-base daycare provider. AFAS is expanding the Child Care for PCS program to include AF members with retirement orders, to include TDRL orders. Certificates are issued within 60 days of their date of departure, which may be different from the date of retirement.

• Respite Care Program

Paid part-time care for an ill or disabled family member. Referral required from Special Needs Coordinator at 677-2598 or the RN Case Manager at 677-3511.

• Education Loans and Grants

Dependent children and spouses of active duty and retired Airmen can work toward their dreams of a college degree with AFAS education grants, scholarships and loans.

Personal Financial Management

Education, information and counseling on personal financial topics including debt management, retirement planning, budgeting, investing, and purchasing decisions. Programs provided as Lunch and Learn seminars (to accommodate the ops tempo) include:

• TSP

Make the decision for a better retirement and learn how to make it great through varied investment options.

Debt Reduction

Learn how to be in control of your debts instead of having your debts control you.

• Daily Money Management

It's not the monthly budget that doesn't work, it's the daily expenditures. Learn new techniques to handle the cash, debit cards, credit cards and loose change.

Relocation/P&WL, & Family Readiness Programs

Helps military and DoD members prepare for relocation. Assists in planning moves, provides information about new location, deals with unique situations, and addresses concerns that may occur in the moving process.

• Plan My Move Program

Provides information and resource tools for members PCSing.

• Wing Newcomer's Program

Typically offered every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month for new military members to the base. Spouses and families highly encouraged to attend.

eSponsorship Application & Training (eSAT)

Provides information and teaches newly assigned sponsors the duties and responsibilities of being a good sponsor. eSAT training can be found at militaryonesource.com under MilLife Learning.

Relocation Resources

Personal and Family Readiness

Provides proper planning, education, and training to alleviate some of the family stressors associated with deployments, evacuations, and peacetime/wartime emergencies.

• Pre- & Post-Deployment Briefings

Heart Link

The goal of Heart Link is to strengthen military families and enhance mission readiness by increasing spouse awareness of the Air Force mission, customs, traditions, protocol and available resources and services.

Key Spouse Program (KSP)

The KSP is a formal commander's unit readiness program to enhance unit family readiness and offers informal peer to peer/wingman family support.

Transition Programs

Separating or retiring military personnel, their family members and DoD civilian personnel are provided transition information on career planning, job search skills, and have access to employment opportunities through workshops, seminars, & individual counseling sessions. The following are offered:

• Initial/Pre-Separation Counseling

Provided at least 365 days prior to service member's date of separation. Required before discharge from the military. This one-on-one counseling and group presentation is designed to ensure necessary assistance and advice on a wide range of services and entitlements including education/training, employment, health and life insurance, relocation and financial assistance. Spouses are welcome.

• TAP Three Day Workshop

Offered monthly this 3-day congressionally mandated program is one of the most comprehensive sources of career broadening information available. It is a cooperative effort among the Department of Defense, Department of Labor, and Veterans' Affairs. TAP addresses military to civilian crosswalk, job-hunting skills, work values, goals, resume preparation, professional image, interviewing, negotiations, and veteran benefits. Spouses are encouraged to attend.

Transition Support Center

For employment and career exploration, the Transition Resource Center includes user-friendly computers, software applications, laser printers, a job board with local and long distance employment opportunities, and resume assistance services.

Installation Voter Assistance Office
