EDUCATIONAL TRAVEL

DESCRIPTION: Educational travel allows for employee's to be able to send their child(ren) for one round trip travel within a 12-month period between Kadena and CONUS for college education purposes.

ELIGIBILITY:

- The student must be under secondary education, which means attendance at a public or private school offering instruction at grade levels 9-12, or equivalent.

or

- The student must be registered in a full-time program at an accredited (1) university or college, including 2-year junior or community college, which offers academic courses leading to a degree, or (2) nursing, performing arts, technical, or vocational institution, leading to a degree, certification, or license.
- The student must be under the age of 23.
- Dependent students over age 21 but under age 23 who are not eligible for PCS travel may be authorized student travel from the school to the post.
 - This one-way travel constitutes completion of the first round trip.
- The anniversary date for authorizing subsequent round trips is established 12 months after the child begins the first annual round trip
- The round trip may be taken at any time within the 12-month period.
 - Round trips or portions thereof not taken cannot be accumulated and carried over to a subsequent period.
- A 30 day period prior to the eligibility date may be allowed on a case-by-case basis.
 - Reimbursement will be made at the time student actually becomes eligible.

PROCEDURE: An acceptance letter from the school administration must be furnished, stating that the student is enrolled on a full-time basis through the end of the school year, or that the student has completed the school year on a full-time basis, at the time travel is requested. If the letter is not available at the time of submission of request, Student Travel Agreement letter may suffices to proceed and provide the enrolment letter once it is issued. Complete and submit PACAF Form 90, Request for Civilian Travel (other than TDY), along with the acceptance letter to 718 FSS/FSCAU at least 30 days prior to requested travel date.
