## COMMISSIONING TESTS (REQUIREMENTS VARY BY PROGRAM)

### AIR FORCE OFFICER QUALIFYING TEST (AFOQT)

This test is required for ROTC, OTS and E-FLEP applicants. Be sure to prepare for the AFOQT as it can only be taken twice (third time w/ approved waiver); 90 days minimum before re-test.

Score requirements vary by commissioning program and are available 10-14 days after testing:

### TEST OF BASIC AVIATION SKILLS (TBAS)

This test is required for OTS *rated applicants only*. Completion of AFOQT is required (minimum score requirements must be met). Three test administrations allowed; 90 days before re-test; scores do not expire. Scores available approx. 72 duty hours after testing: <https://access.afpc.af.mil/pcsmdmz/PCSMscores.asp>

If your program requires the AFOQT or TBAS, contact Base Test Examiner, by email [education@us.af.mil](mailto:education@us.af.mil), to schedule the test. Additional information/documents may be needed prior to testing. AFOQT is not available during WAPS testing cycles.
