Private/Independent Schools Continued

- Follow directions on orientation to register at the sponsor portal: https://registration.dodea.edu/NDSP/privac y-act.cfm
- Research private/independent schools online (talk to your SL for more information)
 - Once you've found a few schools of interest, book Open Days or private tours through the school website or by calling the school
- Once you've chosen a school, register for that school on NDSP Sponsor Portal. To register you will need:
 - Family Budget Planning Tool (available on the site)
 - Fee Invoice from school for all fees
 - School Calendar (if applicable)
- Once you receive confirmation back from NDSP, you are able to register with the school of your choice (physically at the school)

DO NOT register at the school until you have (1) applied on NDSP, (2) received an approval for application email from NDSP. Note: If you register at a school prior to being in the UK, you will have to be reimbursed for the fee after you arrive in country.

School Liaison Services


- Advises Installation Commander on matters relating to schools and military child education

Non-DoD Schools Program

Dependents in Reception (4 years of age) - 12th grade are eligible for the Non-DoD School Program (NDSP). Once accepted to NDSP and their school of choice, students attend local private schools, public schools or they receive homebased instruction.

Private/Independent/International Schools usually have a coach service, and for those schools that don't, please speak to your School Liaison

Key Points for Non-DoD Schools

- Most British schools require uniforms. You will be required to purchase these, unless otherwise stated. Prices of uniforms vary.
- It is strongly recommended that you visit the school that you are interested in to tour the campus, meet the staff and have key questions answered.
- Every school and every child are unique. Select the school that best suits your child.
- Be aware that some schools may be at capacity within some or all grade levels.
- School lunches are the responsibility of the sponsor, even if added into tuition price
- British schools go by Years 1-13, which are equivalent to our K-12. Therefore, Kindergarten is Year 1, grade 1 is Year 2 and so on...Reception is equivalent to our Pre-K.

School Options

- You can send your child to almost any school of your choice, The different types of schools/options most parents choose are:
 - State (Public School)
 - Private/Independent School
 - Boarding School
 - Homeschool

Private Schools

- Weekly or full-time boarding possible
- Independent Schools don't have to follow National Curriculum
- Smaller student:teacher ratio
- Sometimes have higher funding
- Uniforms more expensive
- Pre-paid lunches mandatory

State Schools

- Very rarely have boarding
- Most follow National curriculum
- Larger teacher:student ratio normally
- May have less funding
- Uniforms usually cheaper: sometimes no uniform
- Pre-paid lunches not usually mandatory

- Ensure school of choice has space in the year needed for your child
- Register your child on County Council website
 - Go to "School Admissions" link on Council Website
 - "Apply For A School Place"
 - Follow directions on website from there
- To register you will need:
 - Child's Passport
 - Copy of Sponsor's Orders
 - Proof of Residence (lease agreement or bill with address on it)
